### Materials You'll Need

## Crochet Terminology

## **Crochet Gauge**

To create a gauge swatch:

1. Using the specified yarn and hook, crochet a 4-inch by 4-inch square.

## **Crocheting the Beanie Beret**

2. **Round 3:** Ch 3, \*2 dc in the next dc, sc in the next dc; repeat from \* around. Join. (36 dc)
3. Continue increasing in this pattern, alternating rounds of \*2 dc, sc\* and rounds of \*3 dc, sc\*. Refer to the pattern for specific round counts.

### **Step 3: Create the Body**

1. Once you have reached the desired size for the crown, continue crocheting in the round without increasing.
2. Refer to the pattern for the number of rounds to crochet for the body of the beret.

### **Step 4: Finish the Beanie**

1. Fasten off the yarn and weave in any loose ends.
2. Embellish the beret as desired, such as adding a pompom or crocheting a flower motif.

### **Crocheting the Headband**

Once you have completed the beanie beret, let's move on to crocheting the matching headband.

#### **Step 1: Create the Foundation**

1. Ch a multiple of 4 plus 3 (for example, 31 ch for a headband that is approximately 6 inches wide).

#### **Step 2: Create the Headband**

1. **Row 1:** Sc in the 2nd ch from the hook and in each remaining ch. Turn.
2. **Row 2:** Ch 3 (counts as first hdc),hdc in each sc across. Turn.
3. Continue crocheting in the round using the pattern stitch specified in the pattern until the headband reaches the desired length.

### **Step 3: Finish the Headband**

1. Fasten off the yarn and weave in any loose ends.
2. Sew the ends of the headband together to form a loop.

### **Care Instructions**

To ensure your crocheted accessories maintain their beauty, proper care is essential:

- Hand wash or machine wash on a gentle cycle in cold water.
- Use a mild detergent.
- Do not bleach.
- Lay flat to dry or tumble dry on a low heat setting.

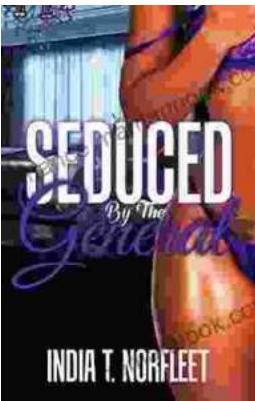

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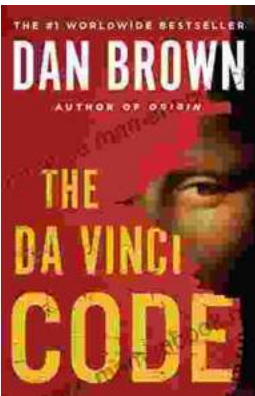


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
